Answers and Explanations

1. c) *had known* – This is a third conditional sentence (unreal past), requiring the past perfect verb form.

2. *c) studied* – This is a second conditional sentence, and the past simple is used for unreal present situations.
3. *c) were* – This is a second conditional sentence, and the verb "were" is used for hypothetical situations.
4. *c) had left* – This is a third conditional sentence, requiring the past perfect form.
5. *a) win* – This is a first conditional sentence, where the present simple is used for real future situations.
6. *b) had* – This is a third conditional sentence, indicating an unreal past situation.
7. *c) had been* – This is a third conditional sentence, referring to a past unreal situation.
8. *c) hadn't missed* – This is a third conditional sentence indicating an unreal past situation.
9. *c) had known* – This is a third conditional sentence referring to a past unreal situation.
10. *c) had arrived* – This is a third conditional sentence, requiring the past perfect form for unreal past situations.
11. *c) had asked* – This is a third conditional sentence. "Had asked" indicates the unreal past situation.
12. *b) studied* – This is a second conditional sentence, where the past simple verb is used for unreal present situations.
13. *c) had gone* – This is a third conditional sentence with an unreal past situation.
