Answers and Explanations

1. *Past perfect* – "Had already left" indicates an action completed before another past action.
2. *b) had left* – Correct past perfect tense for unreal conditionals in the past.
3. *Passive* – The subject "project" receives the action.
4. *b) attend* – Subjunctive mood requires the base form of the verb.
5. *b) I suggest that she take a break.* – Subjunctive mood expresses a suggestion.
6. Error: *don't* → *doesn't* – Third-person singular requires "doesn't."
7. *put up with* – Replaces "tolerate" as a phrasal verb.
8. *b) is* – "Neither" takes a singular verb.
9. *c) has lain* – Correct past participle of "lie" (to recline).
10. *must* – Modal verb indicating obligation.
11. Error: *is* → *was* – Maintain past tense sequence for reported speech.
12. *b) will have lived* – Future perfect tense.
13. Error: *was* → *were* – Use "were" for subjunctive mood in hypotheticals.
14. *reading books* – Replace infinitive with a gerund.
15. *b) submit* – Subjunctive requires the base form of the verb.
16. *Exhausted* – Past participle functioning as an adjective.
17. *d) was finishing* – Past continuous tense for an interrupted action.
18. Error: *has* → *have* – "Police" is a plural noun.
19. Error: *to go* → *going* – Correct verb is a gerund after "insisted."
20. *c) put up* – Correct phrasal verb meaning "tolerate."
21. *b) The house is being cleaned by them.* – Passive voice.
22. Error: *has* → *have* – Plural subject "friends" requires "have."
23. *c) was going* – Past continuous tense for an action in progress.
24. *She enjoys to play the piano.* – Replace gerund with infinitive.
25. Error: *will study* → *studies* – First conditional requires simple present tense in the "if" clause.
