Answers and Explanations

1. a) *in* – We use "interested in" when expressing interest in a subject or activity.
2. b) *on* – "Insist on" is a phrasal verb that means to strongly demand or request.
3. c) *at* – "Good at" is the correct phrase for expressing proficiency in something.
4. a) *of* – "Accused of" is the correct prepositional phrase for blaming someone for an action.
5. c) *for* – "Responsible for" is the correct preposition when referring to someone's duties or tasks.
6. b) *on* – "On" is used when referring to the surface of something.
7. a) *for* – "Apologize for" is the correct phrase when expressing regret about an action.
8. a) *for* – "For" is used with durations of time (e.g., for five years).
9. a) *at* – "Angry at" is the correct preposition when directing anger toward a person.
10. a) *to* – "Look forward to" is a phrasal verb that requires the preposition "to" (despite "to" being part of the verb phrase).
11. c) *over* – "Jump over" is the correct phrase when referring to leaping across an obstacle.
12. c) *in* – "In" is used for enclosed spaces like rooms or buildings.
13. a) *to* – "Ran to" is the correct preposition when heading toward something.
14. b) *on* – "On" is used for surfaces (e.g., a shelf).
15. a) *to* – "Married to" is the correct prepositional phrase when referring to one's spouse.
16. a) *at* – "At" is used for specific locations like desks or tables.
17. b) *for* – "For" is used to indicate the purpose or reason for an activity (e.g., a picnic).
18. a) *about* – "Talking about" is the correct phrase for discussing something.
