Answers and Explanations

1. *c) the* – “The” is used to specify a particular noun, and the speaker refers to a specific book.
2. *b) the* – “The” is used for specific, known objects (pen on the desk).
3. *a) some* – “Some” is used with plural countable nouns when the exact number is not specified.
4. *b) an* – “An” is used before words beginning with a vowel sound.
5. *b) the* – “The” is used to refer to something specific, in this case, the best movie the speaker has seen.
6. *c) the* – “The” is used to refer to a specific item (book given by someone).
7. *c) the* – “The” is used to refer to a specific noun (the only person I trust).
8. *b) any* – “Any” is used in negative statements or questions when referring to an unspecified amount.
9. *d) some* – “Some” refers to an unspecified amount in a positive statement.
10. *b) All* – “All” is used to indicate the entirety of a group.
11. *a) some* – “Some” is used for an unspecified but positive amount of help.
12. *b) no* – “No” indicates the absence of something.
13. *a) many* – “Many” is used with plural countable nouns to indicate a large number.
14. *a) Most* – “Most” refers to the majority of a group.
15. *c) some* – “Some” is used for a portion of an uncountable noun (bread).
16. *a) many* – “Many” is used for countable nouns (people).
17. *a) any* – “Any” is used for negative or question forms.
18. *a) a* – “A” is used before singular, countable nouns starting with a consonant sound.
19. *c) much* – “Much” is used with uncountable nouns (time).
20. *b) some* – “Some” is used when referring to an unspecified amount or number of countable objects.
21. *a) a, a* – “A” is used for singular, countable nouns that begin with a consonant sound.
22. *a) any* – “Any” is used with uncountable nouns in negative sentences.
23. *b) some* – “Some” is used for non-specific advice.
24. *d) Most* – “Most” is used to refer to the majority of a group or amount.
25. *c) much* – “Much” is used with uncountable nouns (money).
